QUESTIONS FOR ORAL ANSWERS

Tuan Haji Abu Bakar bin Hamzah: To ask the Prime Minister to state the broad outlines of "Policy of Renewal" announced by him recently and whether this policy is different from the "new economic" policy as announced by him before.

Tuan Wong Seng Chow: To ask the Minister of Defence to state what instructions are given to the Armed Forces with regard to accidents involving Armed Forces and civilian vehicles, and if there are such instructions, what steps are taken to ensure that they are not disobeyed.

Tuan Wong Seng Chow: To ask the Minister of Home Affairs. to state the number of civilian lorries and Armed Forces vehicles booked for speeding offences in each State, the number of such offences which were compounded and the number brought to Court.

Tuan Yeap Kheng Yam: To ask the Minister of Communications to state whether he is aware that filthy exhaust fumes of lorries (including the lorries of the J.K.R.) buses and taxis on the roads constitute a health hazard to the people, and if so, whether he has taken effective steps to overcome this problem.

Tuan Yeap Kheng Yam: To ask the Minister of Communications to state why the Road Transport Licensing Board of West Malaysia has recently rejected an application from the Students' Vehicles Association of Perak for a mini-bus for the use of the members of Association whenever their school buses encounter breakdowns and whether he will re-consider the application.

Tuan Yeap Kheng Yam: To ask the Minister of Communications to state the conditions required of a person applying for a taxi licence; and whether a taxi licence holder has to operate his own taxi or he may rent it out to others.

Tuan Haji Abu Bakar bin Hamzah: To ask the Minister of Labour and Manpower to state the number of strikes that took place in 1972 and in how many of them the Ministry had to intervene for the benefit of the workers/employers.

Tuan Haii Abu Bakar bin Hamzah: To ask the Attorney-General to state the number of Legal Aid Bureaux established in West Malaysia and the number of people who have received aid from this Bureaux.
