Dear YB Sir/Mdm,

This is my first installment post PSC hearing in KK.

About my statement on the "PDRM has a culture of "untouchable" as queried by the Police Officer at the hearing, I would like to add more comment as follows:-

1. I had been dealing with the Police as a victim and come to that conclusion;
2. I believe those who made such great noise disturbance in the Perlis room while the top police officers were sharing their presentations inside Kedah room were people from PDRM. I had attended many, many forums, several PSC before never witness such aggravating public disturbance indicating their culture of untouchable as they believe they are always right. There was totally no restraint while the hearing was going on.
3. I had lived in London 1974-1980 and I had some problems with some neighbors over some petty thing like parking and they managed to call the Police but the Police officers were professional and polite too and I was never called to the police station to lodge Police Report or give statements despite several times..
4. The cases shared by the lady "shirley" is a glaring example of Police high handedness and give the perception of untouchable as they can do with impunity.
5. I had only 6th November, 2019 lodged two Police reports on the incident of Double Six after a Police Report was lodged against me by Rakimin Nawin on 19 August, 2019 and it was published in Daily Express on 21 August, 2019 to harass me. I had submitted the two Police reports to Daily Express on 7th Nov 2019 3am and as at 9th nothing has appeared in Daily Express. Why? I will wait a few days more to contact Daily Express. (there is much more on this to relate this story)

As I just got the IPCMC act yesterday, I would go through it and come back to you with some more comments.

Second instalment of PSC hearing in KK on 10/11/2019

1. The disturbance and very loud noises considered as public nuisance in the Perlis room could be coming from those "Police" personnel and is tantamount to obstruction for the performance of PSC in its public duty of utmost importance.
2. Nobody seems to stop them doing it over an hour and disrespect to the PSC hence disrepute to the proceedings of the Parliament in sessions at the Kedah room.
3. Should not the PDRM takes its own action in discipline to support its own seniors in the Kedah room in more sober manners and these officers could raise their issues in the Kedah room later rather than causing the "demonic" commotions and disruption before those speakers finished speaking in Kedah room.

Third instalment of PSC hearing in KK on 10/11/2019

Re: RUU on IPCMC

1. The RUU on IPCMC is inadequate to deal with the 125 recommendations of the RCI on IPCMC in 2004/2005.
2. Section II 4 (e) contains the “mana-mana undang-undang bertulis” can be too broad. Can IPCMC be more specific to indicate various laws applicable to the performance of PDRM?
3. Clause 7 appears to be no penalties for not notifying the IPCMC in good time for such occurrences as delays means justice denied to the victims. Also separate SOP be implemented for such drastic events.
4. About possible “cover-up” in certain instances, what would be the reaction to such cases?
5. Can the Police personnel as “aggrieved” bring their cases to Courts?
6. If IPCMC fails in Parliament, would the Police Act be amended accordingly to bring forth integrity and public confidence in the performance of the PDRM?
